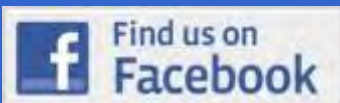

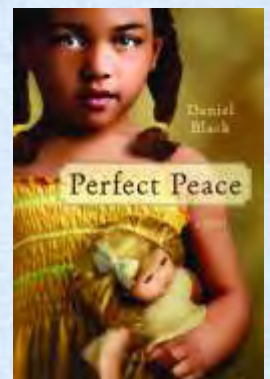

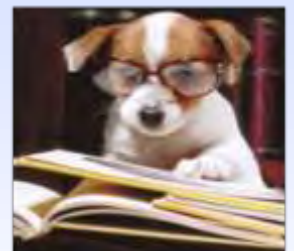
# MUSICAL STORY GO-ROUND

Did you know that internet users are more likely to visit libraries than non-internet users, according to a recent survey by the *Institute of Museum and Library Services* (IMLS)? Actually, libraries continue to flourish despite the "paperless revolution" and Google and other internet applications. In the year that IMLS studied internet access, 77 million Americans 14 years and older took advantage of their public library's internet. So why are public libraries so wildly successful while businesses fail? Because we have community support. In return, we not only provide internet access, we provide computers and printers and databases and classes and brochures.

What are people searching for on the Internet? Many are looking for employment. South Holland Public Library is now offering a database, **Brainfuse**, with on-line live career coaches and job coaches. They speak both English and Spanish and can help you writing your resume among other skills. This is a **JobNow!** feature found under **Online Resources** on our website. ### TAX FORMS

The South Holland Public Library has begun to receive the Federal and State (Illinois only) tax forms, to be filed by April 17, 2012. While not all of the forms we've requested have come, many of the commonly-used forms are now available. If we do not have the forms you need, you can search the IRS website ([www.irs.gov](http://www.irs.gov)), and the Illinois Department of Revenue ([www.tax.illinois.gov](http://www.tax.illinois.gov)) and download the forms to your own computer.

You may also print forms from the library computers at a very reasonable cost, using our print system. Illinois will not be mailing any individual tax booklets this year, so please feel free to come in and pick up your own copy. Please remember, **our library staff is unable to answer tax questions**, but we may supply forms and phone numbers for further assistance.
